






The following template can be used as a simple lift-the-flap activity to practice single articulation sounds.


However, it will also work at the phrase level. i.e. "can under butterfly" or "The watering can is under the butterfly."




















































Print the following page on colorful cardstock.


Glue the flowers flat into your notebook.


Fold at the dotted line on the circle templates to create a small flap.

Now you're ready to practice!








In this section you will find a "double - door" flap template. Make the cut up through the center of the image last, after it has been stuck into the notebook.












The templates in this section are sized to neatly house 5 mini-images under each flap. Use them as revision activities to cover all of the sounds you've been working on.








The templates on the following pages can be glued down inside your notebook to create a multi-layered flap activity.
