



On the following pages you will find 12 superhero themed word cards. They are useful for quick and easy vocabulary games and activities when you have a few moments to fill.


Here are some ideas for using them. I'm sure you will think of many more!

- Use the cards as writing prompts to help younger students write the words into a vocabulary notebook. Have them draw a picture of each word underneath.










