









# Plurals

Cut out the 4 frames below and put them in the correct order. Then glue them to a blank page.

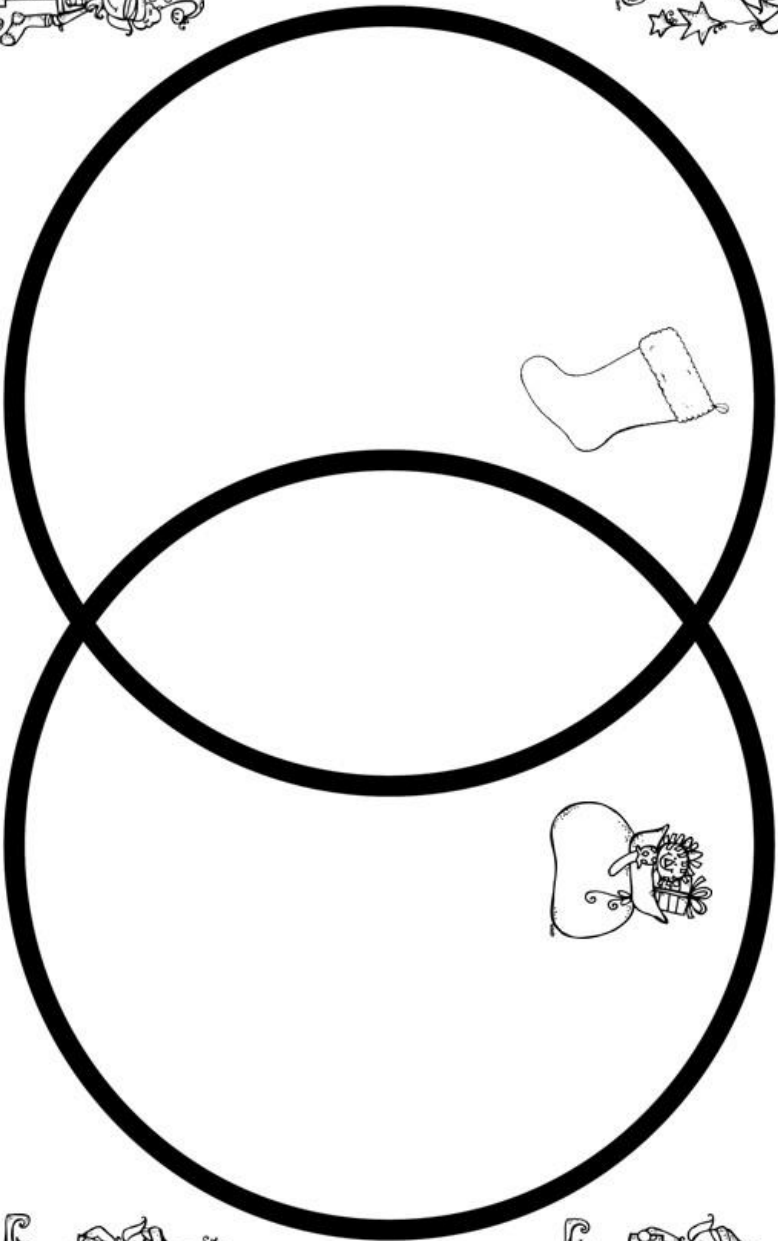

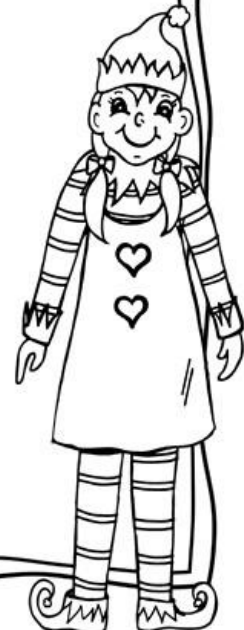
