



On the following pages you will find quick and easy "print & go" activities and worksheets suitable for a wide range of students on your caseload.


From simple labeling through to multiple meaning words, these activities will keep your students occupied and learning.


Use them to challenge early finishers or send them home for extra practice.



















Categorizing

Cut out the pictures below and paste them in the correct category.






Sequencing Activity

You may write a description of the steps beneath each picture if you wish.












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




Following Directions

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Vocabulary Cards





On the following pages you will find 12 Fall themed word cards. They are useful for quick and easy vocabulary games and activities when you have a few moments to fill.
