




From simple labeling through to multiple meaning words, these activities will keep your students occupied and learning.



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



Categorizing

Clothes you might find a witch wearing.	Things you might see while trick-or-treating.
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





Sequencing Activity

Cut out the 4 frames below and put them in the correct order. Then glue them to a blank page.












Cut around the outer edge and have your student complete the activity. Then help them to secure the worksheet into their notebook for later review.
