



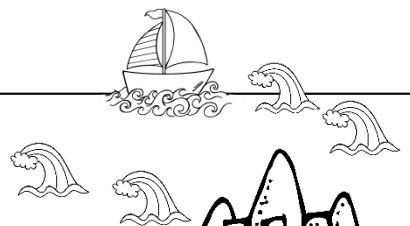
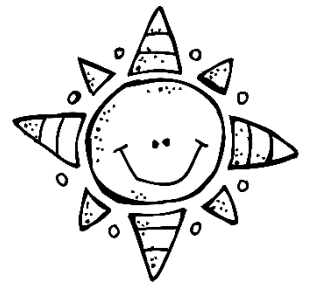

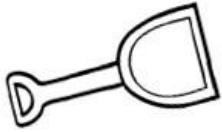


On the following pages you will find quick and easy “print & go” activities and worksheets suitable for a wide range of students on your caseload.

Use them to challenge early finishers or send them home for extra practice.



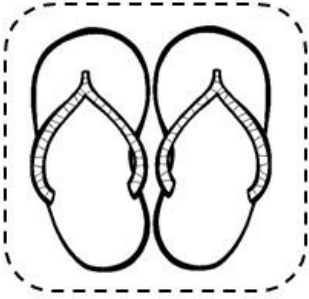
