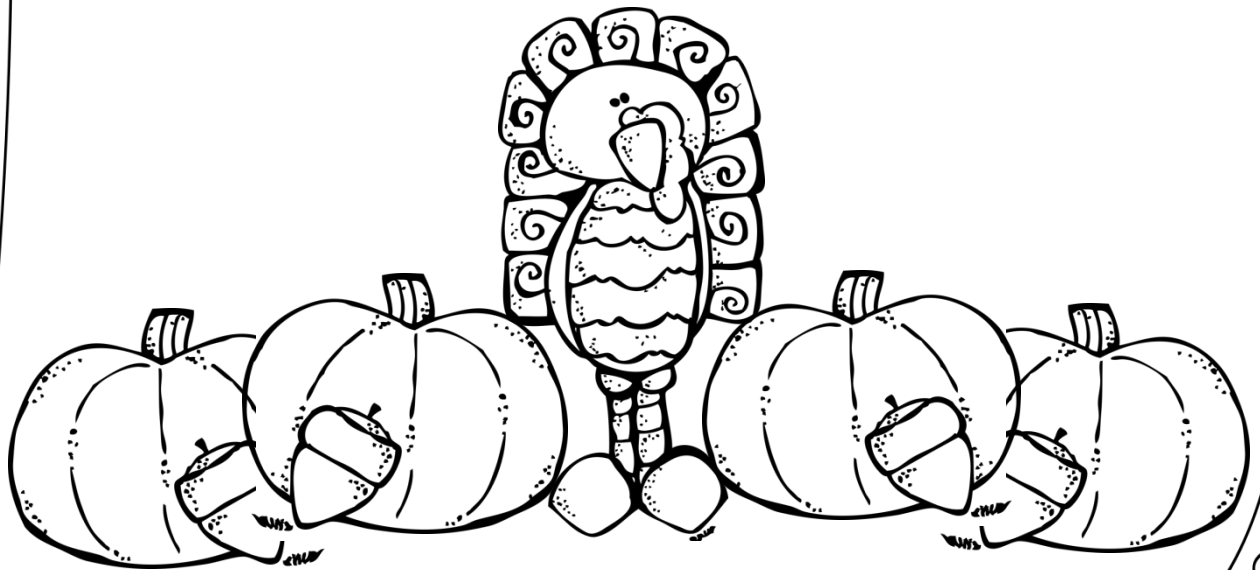


# Print & Go Activities

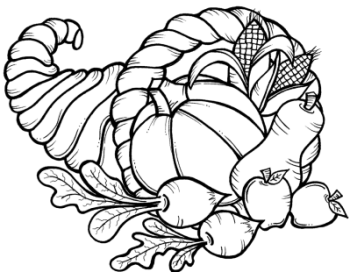
# Vocabulary Cards
