*Please note – this game is a variation of I have / who has? However, the start and finish point has been left deliberately open ended so you can choose who starts. Also, you may find you need to remove a pair of cards from the game due to regional accent variation and so the game will still function in this case.

On the following pages you will find pairs of synonym cards. Separate them into single pictures and their matching text cards. Give one card to each child in the group, making sure that you give out both cards in the pair.

Divide the group into 2 halves and tell one half that they have the questions, and the others that they have the answers.


The student with "question" cards take turns to ask the group, "Who has a word that is a synonym of... (jump)?"


The students can then give each other a high five (or whatever "winning" signal you choose and return their cards to the teacher.



Send the black & white version home for practice.














