Using Noun + is + Adjective Phrases

Goal: Uses auxiliary (is) + adjective in

a phrase.

Materials: • Color Sort cards (32 cards)

Color Sort baseboard

Activity Instructions:

- Take the baseboard and place on the table in front of your child. Shuffle the noun cards and place in a stack close by.
- Ask your child to draw a card and decide together which color it belongs to. Place the card in the correct spot on the board.
- As your child understands the task, ask them to tell you why they placed the card in that spot. Prompt them to use a sentence.

Example



You say, "That's right, it belongs there. Why does it go there?"

Your child says, "The dress is red".



Hint: Decide with your SLP on an acceptable sentence structure for your child. E.g. children working at an early level may say "dress red" and later you may wish to target "Because the dress is red".
