Instructions for Speech Language Pathologists

- The activities in the packs are suitable for home and clinic use but are intended to be used under the guidance of a qualified SLP to ensure correct usage.
- Instruction sheets are written in parent friendly language as a time saver for you. Just print the instructions directly and send as a take home activity along with an extra copy of activity pages. (I like to keep a spare set pre-made so that I always have one to lend for homework).
- The activities are written to start at the most basic level of the teaching task, as soon as a child is ready to use pictures rather than objects. The bright, colourful illustrations and "hands - on" nature of the tasks make them an ideal task for transitioning from floor play to table top work.

Please note - The licence under which the graphics are used does not permit packs to be shared between users. You have purchased a licence to use the pack directly with your own clients, not to redistribute it to other SLPs. Thank you for understanding.

Activity Assembly Instructions

- Take time to familiarize yourself with the materials contained in the pack. You may wish to print only certain pages or to print some pages in color and others in grayscale.
- I prefer to print the baseboards, the cut-out characters and the
 picture cue cards in color. I then print grayscale or black and
 white copies of instruction pages for parents as needed.
- I laminate all the color pages to help them withstand daily clinic use. For occasional home use this may not be necessary.
- You can cut out the characters in each pack directly on the lines or make it easier by leaving some white border around each picture.
- The activities work well as "cookie sheet" games. To use them like this, place the baseboards on cookie sheets and use sticky back magnets on the back of the cut outs. This way they will stick to the baseboard.

Sheets of magnets are cheaply available in Walmart or on Amazon – they are often used for the back of business cards. Only a small piece is needed for each one. I used one A4 sheet of magnetic discs to make eight packs. I used the discs for larger pieces and the surround for smaller cut outs.
