



You can use the craftivity to work with your students who have goals for asking and answering questions. I suggest allowing review time at the end of the activity or during the next session to incorporate these goals.

The following are example questions you may wish to use. Consider writing them onto strips of paper and having students choose a question to read if you would like to minimize teacher involvement.

Example Questions

What did you make? What materials did you use? Who helped you to make the craft? Who will you show your craft to? Where did you make your craft? Where did you stick the eyes? Why did you choose to add feathers? Why did you enjoy this activity? When did you make this craft? When will you tidy up?
